A Message from Bryan

It is so hard to believe that I have been here in San Angelo for a whole year. God has been so

good to my family for bringing us here. We have been through a lot together and I am thankful every day that you are a part of my life. Yes...even you! I wanted to take a moment and thank all of you who prayed for me as I completed the ordination process to become an Elder in the United Methodist Church. For those who aren't familiar with ordination in the UMC, allow me just a moment to share with you a bit of what I know and have experienced.

For me, the process took 8 years. From my declaration as a candidate through the ordination ceremony on June 8th, I met with District Committees on Ordained Ministry, Conference Boards of Ordained Ministry, and I've had men-

tors, District Superintendents, Residency Boards, and colleagues who have guided me to this point. On June 7th, I was elected as a Member in Full Connection to the Rio Texas Conference, and on June 8th, I was ordained as an Elder by Bishop Robert Schnase, our conference bishop.

At that service, hands were placed on my head and my shoulders, symbolic of the commissioning of Barnabas and Paul (see Acts 13), as they were set apart for work in the church. I was told to take authority to order the life of the church, preside over the sacraments, preach the word, and serve the communities to which I have been appointed. It was a Holy Moment, and one that I will never forget or take lightly.

I would also be remise if I failed to mention Miranda and my beautiful kiddos. Miranda has been a rock for me. She was there through all my anxieties and fears, all of my joys and excitements. She walked with me through a very difficult transition from youth ministry to ordained ministry, and even a bittersweet transition from one appointment to the next. I could not have done any of this without her.

I pray that as we move forward in this next year that we get to experience God's Grace and Joy in ways that we have never experienced! I pray that God continue to bless First Church San Angelo, and that he continue to equip leaders for his Church.

CAREPORTAL Meets Needs of Children and Families

Our church has volunteered to be a part of the **CarePortal** team in our area. **CarePortal** is a <u>Faith-Based Outreach Program</u> that works directly with child welfare workers and local churches to meet the needs of foster children and their families. When a need arises, a caseworker will send an email

out to designated contacts at local churches. The contacts will then share the need with their congregations in search of aid in fulfilling it. Some needs are monetary, others are more extensive and rely on multiple churches working together to fulfill the requests, and others can be very simple, such as a fire extinguisher or a crib. Often these needs are the last thing keeping a biological family from being reunited or a child being placed in the care of a relative instead of a foster home. Please keep an eye

out for emails regarding **CarePortal** requests in the coming weeks and months and do not hesitate to contact me if you are able to help!




