# Work of the Church: Regarding Safety

For several months a "Sunday Morning Ministry Task Force" (SMMTF) has met representing a broad perspective of the church and we are still continuing that work, in conjunction with the work of other committees, such as Trustees.

At the beginning of May a paid Police Officer began being on site from 8am until Noon. Other churches in San Angelo also have Police or Security presence, and we believe that this presence will help ensure both our safety, safety of our children, and the safety of our guests.

Part of ensuring our safety is that the Trustees and David Hardegree, Facilities Manager have expanded our Security camera system from 10 Cameras to 25. Four of these cameras have been installed on the second floor children's wing. A special thanks to Endowment who purchased these cameras and monitoring equipment. While these cameras are not monitored 24 hours a day, they can be monitored by say a volunteer staff, and they allow us to look back at footage if it were ever needed.

The SMMTF met on Tuesday May 21st and has recommended a group led by James Dusek put together a plan, including use; possible use and estimated related costs for consideration of moving this ministry to the Gymnasium. This work will pull in other professionals and people who can best assess the facilities and possibilities and will bring back a recommendation that would eventually go to the Church Council. Our recent use of the gym as a Red Cross Shelter has shown us the possibilities of expanding the Sunday Morning ministry to possibly include services like showers. Such a ministry would require greater support of the church as well as additional volunteers.

Additionally the SMMTF is asking the Family Faith Formation Team to consider how to reach out to the children and families that often attend the breakfast, especially in the summer.

It was also discussed that we would like to begin a 5 minute devotional in the very near future to expand our feeding from just physical needs to spiritual ones as well.

This work is taking us from feeding ministry to mission and we believe is an important work the entire church can really embrace.

## Work of the Church: Regarding Our Debt

I Will Finish Strong Campaign to payoff the remaining \$60,000 in Capital Debt from the three year campaign that ended in December 2018.

We, First Church, started the race in 2015-16 a Campaign called "Restore, Revive, Reach Out" to raise and complete about \$1.5 for capital maintenance and improvements.

We, First Church competed well and over three years raised and finished the work, all but paying for what is now about a \$60,000 unpledged balance. By that I mean this is an amount that was not raised and payments are being made out of the General Fund.

But Paul reminded Timothy to "Finish Strong" in 2 Timothy 4:7 (NET) "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith!" These are good words for us to not only start strong; compete strong but to be strong to the finish in paying off this debt.

Therefore, approved by Finance and Church Council we will launch a campaign on Sunday June 2<sup>nd</sup> to pay off the debt, and prayerfully we would like to burn the note on Sunday July 7<sup>th</sup> as part of the "Downtown Camp Meeting" with Reverend Carl Rohlfs present. Here is how the campaign will work:

- In the *First*Place Café various printed envelopes will bear the amounts of \$25, \$50, \$100, \$500 and \$1,000. The total of all of these envelopes will reach us to the \$60,000 goal.
- Take an envelope or envelopes representing the amount that you would consider giving to the Finish Strong Campaign and enclose it in an envelope and place it in the offering or return it to the Church Office.

<u>Example</u>: If you are led to give \$2,000 please take two (2) \$1,000 envelopes. Place the \$2,000 in one of the envelopes and put both in the offering or return to the office. This will remove the enve


lopes from the display and the goal.



# Mental Health First Aid Workshop (Adults) - San Angelo

July 13, 2019 8:00 am - 5:00 pm First United Methodist Church (San Angelo)

One in five Americans has a mental illness or substance use disorder, yet many are reluctant to seek help or simply don't know where to turn for care. Recognizing mental health and substance use challenges can be difficult, which is why it's so important for everyone to understand the warning signs and risk factors. Even when friends and family of someone who may be developing a mental illness recognize that something is amiss, they may not know how to intervene or direct the person to proper treatment. All too often, those in need of mental health services do not get them until it is too late.

Mental Health First Aid teaches how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The eight-hour course introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental health concerns, builds understanding of their impact and provides an overview of common treatments. Through role-playing and simulations, it demonstrates how to assess a mental health crisis; select interventions; provide initial help; and connect people to professional, peer and social supports as well as self-help resources.

Mental Health First Aid encourages early detection and intervention by teaching participants about the signs and symptoms of specific illnesses like anxiety, depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, eating disorders and addictions. The program offers concrete tools and answers key questions like "What can I do?" and "Where can someone find help?" Participants are introduced to local mental health resources, national organizations, support groups and online tools for mental health and addiction treatment and support.
